DFRDB UPDATE – December 2018

This will be just a short update to advise that, after more research, we now have a different view of DFRDB concerns.

Herb has developed a new case and submitted it to the Attorney General, with a copy to the Shadow Attorney General (see copy of email below).

This new evidence may come as a shock, particularly to those who campaigned at length for fair indexation. But the evidence, confirming that DFRDB retirement pay and invalidity pay have never been fully indexed, is irrefutable.

We believe our new case will hold up in Court and will put that to the test by submitting complaints to the Commonwealth Ombudsman and the Superannuation Complaints Tribunal.

We encourage you to view the <u>new DFRDB Case</u> but warn that it runs for 34 minutes and 50 seconds and is not directed at the layperson.

Please bring it to the attention of your local member and your state's Senators.
